A PROGRAM STRUCTURED FOR ADULTS

SNU has established a tradition of meeting the unique challenges of adult students, by designing programs for busy adults with family and work obligations.

Classes meet 1 night a week, from 6 to 10 p.m. Students attend class in small groups of about 20, to encourage consistency, motivation, and cohesiveness. The RN/BS program combines concentrated class work and directed independent study. Classes are taught in a seminar format, and depend on individual students to provide feedback and input. Students can complete the RN/BS curriculum in 14 academic months.

As part of the program, we provide the opportunity to earn college credit for prior learning experience. Students may earn college credit for on-the-job training, military training, and life experiences that have provided them with college level learning through the writing of life-learning papers.

Registered nurses, who have earned 60 or more transferable college semester credits, with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.75, can qualify for this extraordinary college experience.
